

Information on Registration, testing, quarantine for entry from high incidence areas

- Status 05 April 2021 -

The Coronaeinreiseverordnung applies nationwide.

Registration:

Anyone entering from a high incidence area must register!

Obligation to test and provide proof:

Anyone entering from a high incidence area and having a stay of more than 72 hours must be tested!

The following are exempt from the obligation to test

- persons who are only in transit and are leaving the Federal Republic of Germany by the quickest route, and
- in the case of stays of less than 72 hours and compliance with appropriate protection and hygiene concepts for persons who transport persons, goods or merchandise across borders by road, rail, ship or air for professional reasons.

Otherwise, proof of a (PCR, LAMP1, TMA2 test (medical certificate or test result in German, English or French, paper or electronic) is required, which must not be older than 48 hours.

Quarantine:

Whether there is an additional quarantine obligation depends on the law of the Bundesländer.

Some of the most important Bundesländer:

NRW

There is no quarantine obligation

for persons entering the country only for transit purposes, if they leave the country again by the quickest route, and

for stays of less than 72 hours, persons who transport persons, goods or merchandise across borders by road, rail, ship or air for professional reasons, and

for crews of inland waterway vessels, provided that basic precautions are taken to avoid contact, in particular refraining from land visits that are not absolutely necessary. (without 72 hours restriction)

Rheinland-Pfalz

There is no quarantine obligation

for persons who only enter the country for transit purposes and leave it again by the quickest route, and

persons who, for professional reasons, transport persons, goods or merchandise across borders by road, rail, ship or air, provided they comply with appropriate protection and hygiene concepts.

Hessen

There is no quarantine obligation

for persons who only enter the country in transit and leave it again by the quickest route, and

for crews of inland waterway vessels, provided that basic precautions are taken to avoid contact, in particular the avoidance of land visits that are not absolutely necessary.

Baden-Württemberg

There is no quarantine obligation

for persons who are only in transit and leave Baden-Württemberg by the quickest route, and

for stays of less than 72 hours, subject to compliance with appropriate protection and hygiene concepts, for persons who transport persons, goods or commodities by road, rail, ship or air on a cross-border basis for professional reasons, and

for persons who transport persons, goods or merchandise by road, rail, sea or air on a cross-border basis for work-related reasons (without 72-hour restriction). Here, the test requirement does not apply to crews of inland waterway vessels, provided that basic precautions are taken to avoid contact, in particular a waiver of land visits that are not absolutely necessary.

Bayern

There is no quarantine obligation

for persons who are only in transit and are leaving the country as quickly as possible, and

for persons who, for professional reasons, transport persons, goods or merchandise across borders by road, rail, ship or air.

Niedersachsen

Here, the regulations for a stay in a high incidence area within the last 14 days apply!

There is no quarantine obligation

in the case of stays of less than 72 hours and compliance with appropriate protection and hygiene concepts for persons who transport persons, goods or merchandise by road, rail, ship or air on a cross-border basis for professional reasons, as well as employees of air, ship, rail or road passenger transport companies.

For persons who transport persons, goods or merchandise by road, rail, ship or air on an unpostponable cross-border basis for work-related reasons (without a 72-hour restriction). In this case, the test requirement does not apply to crews of an inland waterway vessel or tanker, provided that measures are taken to avoid contact with other persons, in particular a refrain from land visits that are not absolutely necessary.

Furthermore, the quarantine requirement does not apply to persons who are required for work-related reasons by air, shipping, rail or road passenger transport companies.

Sachsen-Anhalt:

There is no quarantine obligation for

persons who enter Sachsen-Anhalt only for transit purposes and leave the state as quickly as possible, and

if appropriate protection and hygiene concepts are adhered to, for persons who transport persons, goods or merchandise across borders for professional reasons by road, rail, ship or air.

Overall, the following applies: The decisive factor is whether you have been in a high-incidence area within the last 10 days (14 days in Niedersachsen) and not whether you have come directly from there. So even if you have stayed elsewhere in between, all regulations for entry apply.
